 - **Needed items:** Nonperishable, prepackaged food, preferably easy to open and prepare; individual-serving items such as pudding and applesauce cups, cereal and granola bars, meat sticks, trail mix, mac and cheese cups, microwavable soup cups, Vienna sausages, individual chicken and tune salad, juice boxes and mini water bottles.
