# TIPPERARY ALL-IRELAND CHAMPIONS 2025

Tipperary are All-Ireland champions for the **29th time** after they completed a stunning second-half comeback to seal a 15-point final victory over Cork in Croke Park, following a remarkable performance, perhaps one of the very best ever at an All-Ireland final.

Down by six points at half-time against a Cork side widely backed to end their 20-year wait for MacCarthy Cup success, Tipp dug incredibly deep and ended the game with a quite remarkable 15-point win with their bare hands.



Up to 50 thousand fans from all over the Tipperary converged on Thurles and FBD Semple Stadium to welcome Liam Mac Carthy back to the Premier County. The stadium was packed to the rafters on Monday night to celebrate with the All-Ireland-winning team as they arrived home from Dublin.



**Celebrations also continued in Liam Cahill's hometown of Ballingarry on Saturday last, with Honorary President of Ballingarry GAA, Paddy O' Connell, proudly leading the team onto the pitch**

# SHINE'S GREEN RIBBON CAMPAIGN

Shine's Green Ribbon Campaign, an initiative aimed at reducing mental health stigma in Ireland. Shine, informed by individuals with lived experiences of mental illness, has been working nationally for over a decade to challenge stigma and promote mental health awareness. The Green Ribbon Campaign, held every September, encourages open conversations about mental health and distributes free green ribbons as a symbol of solidarity.

Key ways to support the campaign include hosting Green Ribbon events, increasing awareness on social media using hashtags (#GreenRibbonIRL, #EndTheStigma, #StampOutStigma), participating in Shine's Workplace Programme, and downloading campaign materials from their website. Suggested events include Walk and Talks, tea/coffee mornings, and lighting buildings green using specific bulbs or filters.

The document also provides tips for talking about mental health, emphasizing listening, avoiding clichés, and engaging in everyday conversations. Shine promotes environmental sustainability by using recyclable materials for campaign items, such as RPET ribbons and recyclable backing cards.

The purpose of the Green Ribbon Campaign is to reduce mental health stigma in Ireland by encouraging open conversations about mental health, fostering solidarity, and promoting a more compassionate and supportive society. It aims to raise awareness, engage communities, and help end discrimination and social exclusion associated with mental illness.

Individuals can support the Green Ribbon Campaign in several ways:

1. **Wear a Green Ribbon:** Show solidarity and support for mental health awareness.
  2. **Host Events:** Organize activities like Walk and Talks, tea/coffee mornings, or mental health awareness events in workplaces, communities, or homes.
  3. **Distribute Ribbons:** Order free green ribbons online or pick them up from participating outlets like Irish Rail Stations and Eir stores.
  4. **Engage on Social Media:** Follow, like, and share Shine's posts, create your own posts using hashtags (#GreenRibbonIRL, #EndTheStigma, #StampOutStigma), and share photos of your participation.
  5. **Light Up Green:** Illuminate buildings in green using LED lights, green metal halide bulbs, or green gels to visually support the campaign.
  6. **Join Shine's Workplace Programme:** Participate in a specialized framework to tackle mental health stigma in workplaces.
  7. **Download Campaign Materials:** Access email signatures, posters, social media packs, and more from Shine's website.
  8. **Start Conversations:** Talk about mental health, listen to others, and offer support.
- These actions help raise awareness and contribute to ending mental health stigma.

Exploring our Foundations - On Saturday 23rd August from 11am -4pm the car park at Mick Delahunty Square, Clonmel will be transformed into a medieval settlement as part of Tipperary Museums Free Family Day exploring the origins of Clonmel as a Medieval Walled Town.

The Medieval re-enactment will feature food, board games and pastimes, spinning and weaving, battle including health and hygiene, a weapons display and traditional craft demonstrations with opportunities for visitors to interact with re enactors, handle artefacts, view traditional craft workers demonstrate their skills in stone and wood working, straw and rush craft and there will be a chance to take part and try your hand at some of the activities.

The car park at Mick Delahunty Square in front of the Museum will be transformed into a medieval settlement to celebrate Clonmel's origins as a medieval walled town. There will be an opportunity for visitors to interact with the living history specialists, to ask questions and handle artefacts associated with war, food, medicine and crafts. There will also be traditional craft demonstrations in wood/stone carving, farrier, spinning and straw craft. There will even be battle training. The School of Irish Archaeology who ran our recent summer camps will be there with the Big Dig for all to take part in . The Big Dig excavation in association with The School of Irish Archaeology will allow all the family to try their hand at being an archaeologist.

Both of these are Drop in events running from 11am to 4pm.

Other events taking place on the day that require booking are:

Michael Fortune of Folklore.ie will present a lecture at 11.30am in Clonmel Library on his Irish Dressers project.

There will be story telling with Bálór in Clonmel Library from 2pm -3pm

Art and craft workshops with Evelyn Kelly in the Museum at 11am, 12.30pm and 2pm.

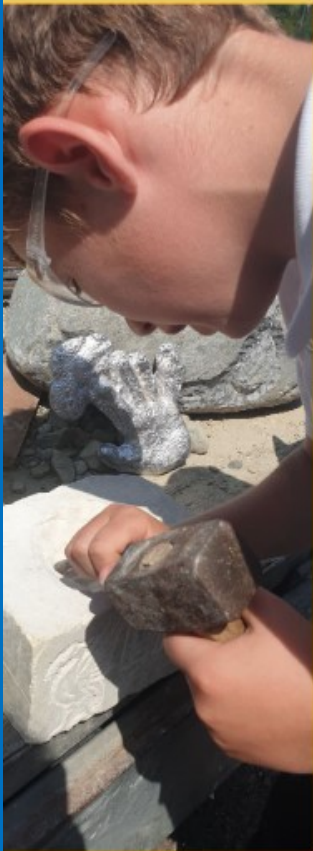
