Eishet Chayil is taken from the closing chapter of the Biblical book *Mishlei* (Proverbs). In particular, it represents Shabbat, which is referred to in the feminine form in Hebrew and also represents the tremendous potential of Jewish women. The Midrash (early rabbinic teaching) on *Mishlei* uses examples of Jewish heroines which it relates to the sentences which make up *Eishet Chayil*.

For example, the phrase, 'rabot banot asu chayil' – many women have excelled in strength – is explained by the Midrash as referring to Ruth the Moabitess, after whom the Biblical book of Ruth is named. Ruth was a widow who gave up the prospect of a comfortable life in Moab, a hostile neighbour of the Jewish people, but instead decided to follow her widowed mother-in-law Naomi, her chosen family, back to Israel to live life as a fully-fledged Jew.

Such strong commitment to Judaism is reflected by so many women today, particularly in Israel where the clouds of war still hover ominously.

Exemplars of this commitment are Yael Eshel whose sister Roni z'l was murdered at the Nachal Oz base, and Yuval Marciano, whose sister Noa z'l was abducted from the Nachal Oz base and murdered in Gaza by Hamas terrorists. Despite this terrible trauma, both Yael and Yuval enlisted in the IDF infantry. Whilst not all women can serve as Yael and Yuval do, every woman's contribution to maintain Israeli society, families and communities is critical and provides an essential service to the country. Women who empower are women who inspire. Our singing of *Eishet Chayil* every Shabbat provides us with a weekly reminder of this.

An *Eishet Chayil* (Woman of Valour) is highly valuable, far surpassing material wealth, and brings good to her family. Her work ethic is strong; she is hardworking, resourceful, and provides for her household with care and diligence. She is generous to the poor and prepared for challenges, ensuring her community is cared for. Her wisdom and dignity shine, and her teachings are kind. She maintains a positive outlook and her efforts are recognized and praised by those around her. Ultimately, it is her fear of God, not superficial charm or beauty, that earns her true honour and praise.
