

PHILLIP GREENE BIO

Philip Greene is an award-winning attorney, historian, and writer. He is Trademark and Internet Counsel for the U.S. Marine Corps (Pentagon), and in 2007 held the position of Senior Research Fellow in Cyberlaw at Victoria University School of Law, Wellington, New Zealand. He is also one of the founders of the Museum of the American Cocktail in New Orleans, and has presented at food and drink events worldwide, including the Smithsonian, the Washington Shakespeare Theatre, the Hemingway Society, the International F. Scott Fitzgerald Society, the Washington Ballet, the Morgan Museum and Library in NYC, the Kennedy Center for the Performing Arts in Washington, DC, and other notable institutions around the world.

Phil is the author of three books, *To Have and Have Another – A Hemingway Cocktail Companion*, (Penguin, 2012, 2d Ed. 2015), *The Manhattan: The Story of the First Modern Cocktail* (2016, Sterling), and *A Drinkable Feast: A Cocktail Companion to 1920s Paris* (2018, Penguin Random House). This most recent book won a coveted Spirited Award (2019 Tales of the Cocktail festival, New Orleans) for “Best New Book on Drinks Culture, History or Spirits,” and was nominated for the American Library in Paris’s Book of the Year Award in 2019. He has just completed the manuscript of his fourth book, *Cheers! Cocktails and Toasts to Celebrate Every Day of the Year*, which will be published in October, 2022 by Sterling’s Union Square imprint. His fifth book, *SWEET, SOUR, STRONG: The Elements of the World’s Best Cocktails in 100 Recipes*, will be published in spring, 2023 by Sterling’s Union Square.

Phil is also a contributing author for the *Oxford Companion to Spirits and Cocktails*, edited by David Wondrich, which was published in October of 2021, and is a columnist for [The Daily Beast](#). He was recently profiled in the [New York Times](#).

He lives in Washington, D.C. with his wife, Elise. Their three adult daughters live in Los Angeles, Chicago and Nashville.
