The <u>Mellon Humanities PhD Interventions Project</u> invites interested students working in humanities or humanisticoriented social sciences to apply for the National Humanities Center *Remote* Summer Residency Program. Please see the details below.

Description: The Mellon Humanities PhD Interventions Project will support up to **10** doctoral students' participation in the National Humanities Center Summer Residency Program (Remote). The theme of the 2020 residency is: "Passionate Teaching in the Research Environment: How to Create Meaningful Online Learning Experiences." This 5-day virtual residency will model best practices for undergraduate teaching in the digital world. Specific topics include (but are not limited to) open education resources (OER), online course design and instruction, how to build community and relationships, interactive teaching technologies, and student assessments and evaluations. The NHC plans to offer this week-long program twice so the students may choose to participate in one of the two sessions.

To apply, please submit the following to <u>LGS.profdev@emory.edu</u>:

- Brief letter of application detailing your stage of PhD program, area of focus, and your reasons for wanting to attend this program, and your preferred session (Session One or Two). Max 1.5 pages, single spaced.
- Email approval of your plan to attend this program from your faculty advisor (if you have one) and your DGS.
- We recommend that you send one email to your advisor and DGS, and copy <u>LGS.profdev@emory.edu</u>with your application. The faculty can simply hit reply to convey their approval of your plan. <u>Note:</u> Faculty do not have to write letters. A simple acknowledgement and support of this plan will suffice.
 The faculty approval(s) must be received no later than Monday, May 4.

Successful applicants will receive a tuition scholarship that covers all the programming for the NHC Graduate Student Summer Residency Program.
