Tiffany's Testimony and Journey to Ministry

I was raised in church. When I was 8 years old, I made a profession of faith and was baptized. I had a relatively solid scriptural foundation and began reading my Bible daily at about the age of 12. Active in several youth groups, I continued that pattern with a Christian organization in college.

But it wasn't until I was in my 30s that the Holy Spirit truly regenerated me. God in His sovereignty had brought me to Grace Community Church in Maryville, Tennessee. Over the next several years of excellent teaching and study, I became aware of my own depraved nature and the depth of my

sin, realizing my dire need for a Savior (Romans 3:10-12, 23; 1 John 2:15-17). What had always been head knowledge finally became heart knowledge, and I became a new creation in Christ (2 Corinthians 5:17).

Providing Quality Christ-centered Education for Students of the Ramu Valley

Constraints of resources, finances, and staffing for Papua New Guinea's schools mean that children in the remote language groups where Ethnos360 works must often travel a full day to be in school. Typically, there are no proper dormitories, so the children must stay overnight with distant relatives or even strangers in some cases.

In the Ramu Valley, the current evangelical church-planting efforts of Ethnos360 have the potential to see the 10 present churches joined by 8 to 12 more in the coming decade. The purpose of this academy is to provide quality and holistic schooling for 7-12th grade students from these regional churches.
