

Testing Matters – SAT vs ACT – PSAT's Value – See Handout



- Schedule in spring will have PSAT scores in Dec/Jan
- Parent meeting in January about what they mean and how to improve
- Could take ACT in spring first and SAT as well
- Can take a second time in the fall of senior year— whichever one is better
- No reason to spend a ton on improving score unless it will get you to a an admissions or scholarship breakpoint
- Take practice tests prepare when scheduled
- Use Kahn Academy to help strengthen weak areas with SAT
- Consider writing portion of SAT and subject tests if Tier I schools targeted






Note: First year students who apply for federal aid can borrow \$5,500 in Stafford loan funds for their first academic year. Parents may also apply to borrow funds from the federal PLUS loan to cover remaining educational expenses.

The FAFSA can be completed at https://fafsa.ed.gov/. Our priority filing deadline is March 1 and our school code is 003704.

All full-time students are required to live in College housing except those that meet specific criteria, which can be found on Bridgewater College's Off-Campus Housing Site.

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Characteristics Colleges Weigh the Most

- Content of the Transcript
- Most rigorous curriculum/workload that can me mastered (A's and B's) in the five core subjects
- Standardized Test Scores
- Extracurricular Activities/Special Talents: athletics, clubs, leadership roles, etc.
- Other: demographics, legacy, etc.



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Primary Take-Aways

- Junior grades are very influential
- Now is the time to develop a list of potential career directions and target schools – drill down
- This spring is the time to visit schools
- Decide when to take the ACT or SAT and study for it
- Schedule a time to talk to each other this is a stressful time and a time of transition
- Realize there can always be a Plan B and there is a school out there that can be a good fit
