Prior to January 2019, Mr. Hill was the president and CEO of Blackstone Alternative Asset Management and vice chairman of Blackstone Group, where he served as a member of the board of directors of Blackstone's general partner since March 2007. Mr. Hill is a graduate of Harvard College and the Harvard Business School. He is a member of the Council on Foreign Relations, where he is chairman emeritus of the Investment Committee and serves on the Council's Investment Committee, and is a member of the Board of Directors of Lincoln Center Theater, where he is chairman emeritus. He is chairman emeritus of the Hirshhorn Museum and Sculpture Garden in Washington, D.C., and currently serves on the Investment Committee of the Smithsonian Institution and the executive committee and the board of trustees of The Metropolitan Museum of Art. He also serves on the board of the Guggenheim Museum, the Telluride Foundation, the Advantage Testing Foundation, the Friends of the High Line, and Our Lady Queen of Angels School, a parochial school (K-grade 8) in Spanish Harlem. He is a member of the advisory board of Christie's and a member of the board of directors of First Eagle Investment Management; Hamilton Insurance Group, Ltd.; Advantage Testing; Inc.; and Crux Informatics.
