

On Sound Footing

A LETTER FROM THE BOARD CHAIR $-\!-$

It is often said that it's not so much how you start, but how you finish that determines the outcome. It's my pleasure to report to you that we finished this year strong! When it became apparent last fall that the school had some major financial challenges to overcome, the trustees of the Lauralton Hall Board (the majority of whom had been on the board for a year or less) stepped up. Over the course of 14 board meetings and several phone-a-thons this group of volunteers went above and beyond to insure that

Lauralton Hall continues to have a bright future.

The Board worked tirelessly to get Lauralton back on a sound financial footing. Trustees took a significant role in fundraising, not only by making early and significant personal contributions to the Loyalty Appeal, but by sponsoring fundraising events and making enumerable direct personal appeals to donors. Several trustees led the successful effort to refinance the school's debt, consolidating the outstanding demand note and mortgage into one instrument. We are very pleased with the interest rate and more favorable terms and conditions provided by our new lender, the Knights of Columbus. The Finance Committee and the Board have worked with Head of School Elizabeth Miller to revamp the budgeting process to ensure a timely and balanced budget for this coming fiscal year. Also, we're putting in place a more rigorous financial reporting routine to ensure the Board has all the information it needs for appropriate oversight.

Other Board actions this year include engaging a new audit firm, T.M. Byxbee Company, P.C. While not a factor in the decision process, we are delighted that the audit partner for Lauralton Hall happens to be a graduate of an all women's college and fully appreciates the benefits of an all women's education. We have also engaged the law firm of Mayer Brown, on a *pro bono* basis, to conduct a forensic study of the school's past business practices. One of the primary objectives of this initiative is to learn from our mistakes and ensure we don't ever repeat our recent experience.

I want to thank our Board members for all of their hard work these last many months. I also want to recognize Georgia Dickinson, Sheila Kempf, Sr. Irene Holowesko, RSM and Mike Amato. While these trustees are retiring from the Board, I will always be grateful to them for all of their many contributions to our success. I especially want to thank you, the Lauralton community, for responding in such a positive and constructive way to the challenges of this past year! Lastly I want to thank Elizabeth Miller, the Board's sole employee. Elizabeth's incredible leadership this last year enabled me to have the exceptional pleasure of shaking the hands of 107 extraordinary young women as they crossed the stage earlier this month to receive their Lauralton Hall diplomas. I'm looking forward to a similar experience when I help welcome the strong incoming Class of 2022 at the matriculation ceremony this coming fall.

I hope to see you all at many of the upcoming Lauralton Hall events such as our golf outing on October 8 at Great River and of course, Christmas in the Mansion on December 1-2. Also, I wouldn't be doing my job if I didn't appeal to you to give as generously as you can to our annual fund. No independent school survives on tuition alone, so please participate and help **Keep Lauralton Strong!**

Celebrating New Alumnae

CLASS OF 2018

On a sunny Saturday, June 2 Lauralton Hall celebrated its 112th commencement awarding diplomas to 107 young women in the Class of 2018.

Lauralton's highest honor, the Catherine McAuley Award, was presented to Jessica Sanchez of Milford. During her four years at LH, Ms. Sanchez consistently demonstrated the Mercy values of compassion, courage, spirit of volunteerism, and sound academic performance.

Valedictorian of the Class of 2018 Caroline Favano of Norwalk will attend Georgetown University in Washington, D.C. where she plans to pursue operations and information management. Salutatorian Lily Wald of Derby will attend Vanderbilt University in Nashville majoring in neuroscience.

Graduates will be attending 70 different colleges in 24 states. Seniors were accepted into some of the most selective engineering, medical, liberal arts, information technology and business undergraduate programs in the country at schools including Boston College, the College of William & Mary, Tufts University, the University of Michigan, the University of Virginia, Wake Forest University, Washington University in St. Louis, and Yale University.

In addition, 29 seniors received Lauralton Hall's Frances Warde Service Award for contributing

more than 100 hours of service during this academic year.

In her remarks to graduates, Head of School Elizabeth Miller advised the young women to follow their "inner GPS." Mrs. Miller said that while it's practical to "store your favorite locations," she encouraged graduates to seize opportunities to "take the detour" and "venture further afield." She also challenged the members of the Class of 2018 to consider the impact and legacy of their Mercy education. Mrs. Miller asked, "Why idle when we can thrive?" reminding the new alumnae that they are greatly needed to advance the Mission of Mercy in the world.

Alumnae Share Career Insight and Advice



Lauralton Hall. He continued to support many through college. His generosity happened quietly, behind the scenes, as he wished. Today, we honor Bill before the entire Lauralton Hall community for his generosity and humility.

Bill passed away in Norwalk on October 6, 2017. After a 32-year law career, he became an ordained Roman Catholic deacon graduating from Yale Divinity School. He was active in the ministry for 22 years at St. Joseph's Church in Norwalk. He also served multiple local agencies supporting public and private education, poor families, and the homeless.

Barbara, Bill's wife of 52 years, told Lauralton Hall that Bill also supported many Fairfield Prep students. At Bill's funeral, many of the Lauralton and Prep beneficiaries volunteered as ushers, as Barbara described, "helping people up our steep steps, escorting them to seats, and handing out programs." With Barbara's approval, the students showed their gratitude by wearing Bill's favorite flower-red roses-on their dresses and jackets.
