- Program registration is limited and is based on a policy of first-come, first-served paid registrations.
- Full payment is due with the registration. Program spots cannot be reserved for those not paid in full.
- Register students for the grade level they will enter in fall 2021. Complete one registration form per student.

Program Cancellation/Refund Policy

Marquette High reserves the right to close programs with maximum enrollment and to cancel programs that do not meet the minimum enrollment 14 days prior to the program starting date. In the event a program is cancelled by the school, participants will receive a full refund.

Families who voluntarily withdraw from the program 14 days or more before the program start date will receive a full refund less a \$10 administrative fee. Refunds will not be given for cancellations that are less than 14 days prior to the program start date. These program fees may be applied to another 2021 Summer EXPLORE! class if space is available.

If a student voluntarily withdraws after the first day of the program start date, no refund will be issued. There is no pro-rated adjustment of the program fees based on the number of days attended.

2021 COVID Safety Protocols

The safety of our community and visitors is our No. 1 priority. Marquette High will take all necessary measures to ensure the safety of all students, faculty, and staff. We follow Milwaukee Health Department guidelines and have consulted with medical professionals to devise safety protocols. The various safety procedures in place at the start of Summer EXPLORE! Programs will be sent to families as part of the reminder email families will receive prior to the first day of class.



Dress Code

General guidelines for summer programs:

- Pants/Shorts: Students may wear casual pants or jeans or cargo-type shorts. They should be neat, clean and without rips or frays. Cut-offs are not permitted. Pants and shorts must be worn at waist level at all times. Students may wear athletic pants or shorts if they are attending a sport camp.
- Shirts: Students may wear a collared shirt, T-shirt or jersey. A collared shirt is either a polo shirt or button down. No inappropriate images or sayings on T-shirts.
- Shoes and socks must be worn at all times. No sandals.
- Hats or sunglasses may not be worn in the building.
- For summer sport camps, students should dress in appropriate athletic wear.

First Day Procedures

Summer EXPLORE! programs will be held at Marquette University High School unless indicated otherwise. Enter at the Henke Center Entrance at 3306 W. Michigan. Students will check in before reporting to the location of their program. If you plan to come in with your student, please park in any of the available parking spaces. The first day check-in procedures will be sent to families as part of the reminder email families will receive prior to the first day of class.

Lunch

If your son is participating in a morning and afternoon class or sport camp, he is welcome to bring a lunch and beverage. An area will be designated for students to have lunch between classes.

Student Behavior

Appropriate student behavior is expected. If a student's behavior makes it difficult for others to learn and enjoy their experiences or for teachers to teach, the summer program coordinator reserves the right to discuss the situation with the student and parents, and if a remedy cannot be initiated, to require the student to withdraw from the program without a refund.

Illness

If a student becomes ill, Marquette High will contact parents and ask that their student be picked up from summer programs or sport camps. Refunds will not be issued based on missed days due to illness.

Insurance

Marquette High does not carry medical or hospital insurance for injuries or illness a participant may sustain in the summer programs. Parents of students participating in Marquette High-sponsored activities must provide their own insurance and assume the risks of all injuries or accidents.

MATH AND COMPUTERS

Journey through Beautiful Mathematics

For boys entering grades 6, 7, 8, 9

This video journey is for students with strong ability and interest in math. We will enjoy many fascinating patterns and concepts, including glimpses at prime numbers, factorials, partitions, regular polyhedra, Euler's formula, the seven bridges of Königsberg, the Möbius strip, pi, the Pythagorean theorem, Fermat's last theorem, sequences, the golden ratio, Pascal's triangle, and probability. We will also listen to a few musical math morsels.

Mr. Temple teaches Mathematics at Marquette High, and once worked as a programmer/analyst for Accenture, Boeing and S.C. Johnson. Note, students will need to bring their own computer.

This camp is designed to introduce students to how money works as well as beginning to effectively manage their own personal finances. Students will explore and develop practical skills in banking and budgeting, understanding paychecks and managing credit to allow them to make informed decisions and begin developing a stable financial future. During the course, students will be introduced to a variety of real-life applications and scenarios through online games and other fun learning opportunities to get them started on the path towards a lifetime of financial literacy.

In this interactive course, students will participate in a stock market simulation as well as other financial simulations and games to enhance their learning experience.

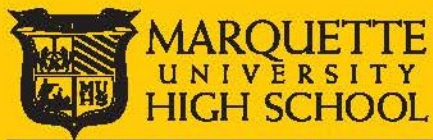
