Senior Passion Project

*If you can not continue with your original plan for your senior project

STEP 1: BRAINSTORM:

- 1. What is your passion? What is something that interests you that you really haven't had an opportunity to try? Do you share a passion or interest with others?
- 2. Need help finding a passion? Try:
 - a. Writing down as many words (or draw pictures, cut images out of a magazine) as you can about things that interest you.
 - b. See if a theme or pattern arises. Hopefully, it becomes more clear something that you could pursue as your passion project.

STEP 2: GET ORGANIZED

- 1. The thing about passion projects is that they're often very big. Let's think about the following questions to help you make a plan:
 - a. What research will you need to do?
 - b. Can your research be broken down into several parts or phases?
 - c. Will you need to enlist anyone's help?
 - d. What materials do you need to get started?
 - e. Do you need to learn any new skills?

STEP 3: MAKE A PLAN

- 1. Every project is made up of small steps: Novels can be broken into chapters, chapters into scenes, scenes into beats.
- 2. List out the steps you will need to complete to achieve your goal(s).
 - a. Think about how much time each step will take.
 - b. Don't overbook yourself, make sure that your project is spread out and you have the proper time to complete each step.
- 3. Sometimes it's helpful to think ahead to possible hurdles that could get in your way.
- What could be a roadblock to my success?
- a. What can I do now to try to prevent getting stuck at that roadblock?

STEP 4: GET GOING

- 1. Make a schedule using your steps above and start your project!
- 2. Have an end-goal in mind but remember that success isn't measured by the final product; it's measured by the process you undertake and what you learn along the way.
