



Overview

- Inspired by the structures of The CEO Water Mandate, the Global Compact water platform, this front addresses concepts and tools for Water Stewardship as a response from companies to water issues.
- In addition, the Action for Water Platform seeks to develop projects with the objective of achieving the specific goals of SDG 6, which aims to ensure the availability and sustainable management of water and sanitation for all by 2030.



ACTION FOR WATER

It aims to collaborate for the construction of a water governance agenda, engaging companies in the adoption of sustainable practices in their operations and in their supply chains to promote the efficient use of water and guarantee access to all by 2030, in line with with SDG 6.

PARTICIPATION

It is currently composed of 85 organizations, including public and private companies, NGOs, academia, UN agencies and government representatives. This is the main forum for discussions on SDG 6 in the RBPG. There are about 5 meetings a year.





Water use efficiency cuts costs

- Diageo reduced its water use by nearly one million m³ in 2014 and saved US\$3.2 million
- A water-efficient soldering practice at Cisco saves more than US\$1 million per year
- A project at Merck will save 2.1 million m³ and US\$500k per year

If the global community had been further along in its progress to meet the SDGs when the pandemic broke, we would be better equipped to face the challenge, writes Giuliana Chaves Moreira of the Pacific Institute.

Unfortunately, we were not prepared, and the pandemic is moving back decades of progress towards a more sustainable future. This presents a huge opportunity to revisit strategies implemented to date, and to prepare for a more sustainable future by building stronger health systems while better meeting basic needs and ensuring that fewer people live in extreme poverty.

We will need "all hands on board" to ensure equity and the sustainable use of resources. It is vital that the global community not quickly forget this crisis, but draw lessons from it to rebuild more equitable and sustainable societies. This must include countries working together to ensure sustainable access to water and sanitation for the 40% of the world's population who still lack access.

COVID-19 and the Global Setback on the UN Sustainable Development Goals

Hand washing is key to fight COVID-19, according to WHO recommendations. Unfortunately, this essential and fundamental measure to prevent the spread of the disease is still inaccessible for the 780 million people around the world who lack access to an improved water source and the 2.5 billion who lack access to proper sanitation. In fact, 844 million people in the world – one in nine – do not have clean water close to home (WHO, UNICEF and JMP, 2017)1. And 2.3 billion people in the world – almost one in three – do not have a decent toilet of their own (WHO, UNICEF and JMP, 2017)1.
