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Germany 2022

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2022 will long be remembered as one of the hottest and driest summers in Europe but the response to the drought from Germany's Rieslings is not what you might expect. Off the back of the electric throwback 2021s, we see similarly delicate wines, with lower alcohols and excellent mineral intensity – not quite as rapier, they will be hard to resist on release with that uncanny knack to age gracefully. It's a good one, folks!

THE BIG PICTURE

The number of dry 'Trocken' Rieslings in our range has increased over the years and now more closely reflects the German home market, although it was interesting to hear from a couple of producers that the new generation of German drinkers are re-discovering and enjoying Kabinett wines - proving these things are so often cyclical! The classic 'fruchtig' wines are of course well represented and they feel related to the exquisite 2021s, there is true delicacy despite the drought and although acidites are a touch lower, the mineral expression adds to a sense of freshness and lift with lower alcohols to boot. These Rieslings are full of charm, but they also have the bones to cellar - the best will have many decades ahead of them. It isn't news but the current crop of growers and winemakers, on the back of the previous generation's work, are embracing organic and biodynamic practices across the regions. Innovative programs of planting between vines improves soil health, biodiversity and water retention - care and attention to detail in the vineyard and patience in the winery means ever better wines, and the ecological approach makes them better prepared for the increasingly common extreme conditions.

THE WINES

It is natural to assume hot and dry conditions might produce clumsy wines, but Riesling has shown great resilience in 2022 and older vines coped well to produce characteristically delicate wines in line with 2021 but with easier-going levels of acidity, a signature spiciness and vitality, as well as excellent mineral expression. It is a super vintage for the off-dry Feinherb and Kabinett wines, which are bright, full of white orchard fruits, lime citrus and leaning towards peach; the Spätlesen are charming and have serious cellaring potential, although Auslesen and above are rare this time round. The moderate acidity levels have produced Trocken wines with great immediate appeal, and this will make an ideal vintage for first timers to try the dry wines, while we will look forward to the grander, late-released examples next

year. It's a lovely vintage, neatly summarised by Christophe Schaefer who commented during our tasting, "brilliancy vs opulence, more seductive and easier than 2021, and cooler wines than the vintage suggests".

THE WEATHER

A mild winter gave way to a warm Spring which accelerated growth in the vineyard but while frost was not an issue in 2022, some rain at flowering affected potential yield. The months of June, July, and August were completely devoid of rain, this drought was more intense than the 2018 vintage, and caused the vines to slow the accumulation of sugars – ripe fruit but lower potential alcohols. September arrived with downpours, and this threw up challenges of when to pick to avoid rot issues and possible dilution, or whether to gamble on better weather later which might produce more of the higher *prädikats* (Auslesen and above). For many, since acidities were already moderate, a decision to pick earlier made the greatest sense and most harvested in late September through early October.

We anticipate shipping these wines in late 2023 & early 2024.

Willi Schaefer

Mosel

The Schaefer family have been tending vines in Graach since 1590 though the estate dates to 1181, but it is really since 1971 when Willi Schaefer took over from his parents that they began to build a reputation. Christoph, who jonied his father in 2002, now heads the estate along with wife Andrea, and they continue to work their 4.5ha with the calm and measured approach Willi employed. Attention to detail in the vineyard means better wines in the glass, they have total confidence in their experience and Christoph prefers to taste the grapes rather than rely on technical analysis. These wines have a voracious international following and it is a pleasure to be able to offer them. We tasted with Christoph and Andrea Schaefer over a zoom call in August. In 2022 they took a practical view, deciding to bottle mainly Kabinett, and to produce a single Spätlese rather than chasing the richer *prädikats*. The Feinherb is exceptionally good this year, the **Himmelreich Kabinett** is going to be tough to resist on release, and the Spätlese utterly cloud-like - they have no doubt that this will have 30-40 years ahead of it!

freshness complemented by honeyed notes giving way to a mouth-watering finish. Perfectly balanced and delicious. 3-9 years.

Graacher Domprobst Riesling Spätlese #05,

Always the most concentrated of the Schaefer Spätlesen, the richness is apparent with pineapple and juicy apricot on the nose. There is a hint of red fruits on the palate that balances well with apple acidity and viscous stone fruit extract. The power all leads to a finish of gentle ginger spice and lychee. The mineral drive means this will age well for 20 years but it's a struggle to not drink now! 5-15+ years.

Kerpen

Mosel

Martin Kerpen and his wife Celia have now grown their estate to 9.5 ha, 3 of which are in Wehlener Sonnenuhr. This estate is classic Middle Mosel – all Riesling grown on blue Devonian slate. The move to the next generation is underway with son Matthias having returned to the winery in 2021 after completing his viticulture studies in Geisenheim. Whilst winemaking is a blend of modern and traditional with small basket presses used and fermentations in large old oak barrels, Martin is keen to stress "The quality of the wine is created in the vineyard and not in the cellar." These dependably show a generous and luscious expression of Mosel fruit, with classic blue slate minerality and the **Blauschiefer Riesling Trocken** is a fantastic introduction to dry Mosel Riesling.

Dönnhoff

Nahe

The Dönnhoff family has been in Oberhausen an der Nahe for over 250 years and have been growing grapes since the late 18th century. While the foundations for the modern estate were laid in the early 20th century by Hermann Dönnhoff, his son (also Hermann) built their first cellars and press house in 1936 and it was his son, Helmut, who achieved international success after taking over in 1971. In 2007 Helmut's son, Cornelius took over the running

of this 28ha estate and they are counted amongst the great domaines of the world. The wines have long had a reputation for exemplary balance, and they have an enviable range of sites to exploit the vast differences in terroir that the Nahe has to offer. There are limited numbers of Spätlesen this year but we are pleased to have again secured an allocation of the new(ish) Niederhäuser Klamm Kabinett, and a clutch of their superb dry wines.

Max Ferd. Richter

Mosel

A great old estate and the Richter family who first purchased vineyards in Brauneberg in 1643 are still here – Dr Dirk Max Ferd. Richter represents the ninth generation, while son Constantin, who is now involved, marks the tenth. The winery, built in 1880, boasts an impressive barrel cellar and from the outside looks like something you might find alongside a North Wales railway line! They have 17ha of vines in some of the middle Mosel's great vineyards, but the Brauneberg is home, the Juffer-Sonnenuhr the jewel, and with climate change in mind they are looking to cooler and

north-facing sites too. Dirk reports on the warmest year since official records began being kept in 1881, yields well below historic averages, fruit of great quality, producing harmonious wines of delicacy and great drinking pleasure. The estate has been on a great run of form in recent times and the wines are hitting big scores from the critics with pleasingly regularity. The sheer drinkability on offer here is amazing but both the Spätlese and Auslese will have many decades ahead of them. An exciting collection this year!

Gunderloch

Rheinhessen

Johannes Hasselbach is the Great-great-grandson of Carl Gunderloch who bought the eponymous winery in 1890. Based between the towns of Nackenheim and Nierstein in Rheinhessen, the red slate soils bring out a spicy quality of Riesling, with notes of plum, rhubarb and ginger, with great viscosity. After a long hiatus, this is the second vintage we have offered of these wines, and the quality is better than ever. Jean Baptiste is open and easy-going with hidden depths; the Nierstein Trocken is an impressive Erste Lage (premier cru) combining that spice with red slate minerality. We have a little of the special Gold Kap Auslese and the GG Rothenburg, their showpiece, is highly sought after.

Peter Jakob Kühn

Rheingau

The Kühn family have lived and worked among the vines in this famous stretch of the Rheingau for 230 years but the estate came to prominence when their 1991 Doosberg won best German Dry Riesling – the first of many awards and all down to the hard work and dedication of Peter Jakob and wife Angela, who had taken over the estate in 1970 from Peter's parents. They achieved biodynamic certification in 2004 and their son, Peter Bernhard along with his wife Viktoria, took the reins in 2012. A superb 18ha of vines on the gentle slopes above the Rhine, centred around the villages of Oestrich and Hallgarten – home to a clutch of grand cru sites including the aforementioned Doosberg. Peter Bernhard ferments and ages his wines in large oak *fuder* which impart toast and richness to the wines. Believing time in barrels is key to allow the wines to gain complexity, this offer includes a number of wines from 2021 which have just been released after extended ageing. The **Oestricher Klosterberg** could be mistaken for a top White Burgundy given its complexity and structure.

Meulenhof

Mosel

Situated in Erden, Meulenhof dates to 1337 and was mostly in the hands of Cistercian monks (and royalty) until secularisation under Napoleon. Since 1919 it has been in the hands of the Justen family, and Stefan and wife Helma took over in 1990. Today the estate totals 7ha, mostly in the steep, terraced Erdener Treppchen and its prestigious Prälat enclave, with vines a little further upstream in the Wehlener Sonnenuhr. They ferment in old oak using natural yeasts in the cellars under the family home and produce rich, ripe, and earthy Riesling, representing excellent value for money.

Rings

Pfalz

Rings estate is based at Freinsheim in the Rheinpfalz and is run by two brothers, Steffen and Andreas Rings who took over from their father in 2001. They make an impressive team and have quickly established themselves as a key producer of high-quality dry Rieslings from Freinsheim, Kallstadt, Ungstein, and the great Saumagen vineyard. Their holdings now total 35ha, any new plantings are at very high

density to control yield and concentration, and all is farmed according to organic principles (though not slavishly), with innovative methods of promoting biodiversity, soil health, and water retention. Rings was admitted to the prestigious VDP organisation in 2016 and this is very much a team to keep an eye on.
