KITE GRADUATIONS 21/22 ACADEMIC YEAR



LTI Pathways to Employment Programme at Knockanrawley Resource Centre (KRC)

This Programme has been running at KRC for over 16 years now. It is an LTI Back to Education programme funded by Tipperary ETB.

It carries a QQI Major Level 4 Award offered on a full-time basis 40 weeks September to June.

Learners get 60 hours work placement; extra Social Welfare allowances may be payable and learners must be open to new skills.

The Programme offers a great supportive learning environment with access to Childcare and other supports. The learners will participate in employable skills like Food Hygiene (HACCP) and Barista Coffee Training.

They will be educated on practical skills like IT, Cookery and Organic gardening and they will also be supported to sit the Driver Theory Test.

As this Course is a Pathways to Employment Programme, progression of learners to permanent and part-time employment has been a real success in the past 2 years. Some learners have opted to advance to further education, e.g. Level 5 which is admirable.

Last year of the 10 Certified – 4 have full or part-time employment, 3 are doing a L5 Course and 1 has secured an apprenticeship. There were 6 Major Awards and 4 component Certificates for this academic year.

The 21/22 **Graduation Ceremony** was held at KRC last week and 10 were certified with their L4 QQI Awards plus other Certificates for Barista Coffee Training, First Aid and the Leave No Trace Project.

Matthew Ryan, Training Manager Tipperary ETB and John Murphy, Development Officer, Tipperary ETB attended the Ceremony and agreed the KITE Programme has been a great success and they gladly fund this Project every year. Well done to all the learners.

KNOCKANRAWLEY ABILITY PROJECT



Knockanrawley Ability Project has started 2023 with a lot of positive developments. With continued collaboration with Tipperary ETB we have finalised an in-depth evaluation report. The aim of this collaboration was to devise a transition programme for Scoil Chormaic participants to support them to realise the many opportunities that await them on leaving school. One of the highlights of the programme was the participation in a career guidance module which facilitated the students to think about the pathway they wish to take and explore the opportunities available. This evaluation report outlines the benefits and challenges for individuals with additional needs on reaching 18 and exploring the next step. The Evaluation of the Transition Programme has been shared with the ETB senior management. We also had the opportunity to present the report to Minister Anne Rabbitte (Minister of State at the Department of Health and Department of Children, Equality, Disability, Integration and Youth.





Since the start of 2023, we have had continued successes with more of our participants progressing to work experience and paid employment. Many thanks to McDonalds Clonmel and Hotel Minella for supporting our partipants. We also had James pass his driver theory test. Well done everyone!



The Tús Programme in South Tipperary

The Tús Programme is operated and overseen nationally by the Department of Employment, Activation and Social Protection (DEASP), while it is managed at a local level by Local Development Companies throughout Ireland. Here in South Tipperary, it is managed by South Tipperary Development CLG (STDC) who have seven Team Leaders strategically placed throughout the operational area to manage Tús at the very local community level.

The Tús Programme was introduced in 2011 by the Fianna Fail government at that time, to try and tackle unemployment which was heading towards 18%. The primary aim was to 'activate' those who were long-term unemployed and to get them back into the habit of working again, or indeed working for the first time. The terms and conditions, both for community groups and participants alike, were very similar to Community Employment (CE) with groups who have participants placed with them having to be from the community and voluntary sector, while the participants have to work 19.5 hours a week with a small financial incentive on top of what they would receive in their weekly social welfare payment. Where the schemes differed was that, firstly, the Tús Programme was for a defined period of 12 months which could not be extended for any participant, and secondly, the Tús Programme, was, and continues to be very much 'participant centred'. While CE had to find a participant to fill a particular role with a particular group, Tús was able to work with an individual to find a position with a community or voluntary organisation that a person was happy to work in and which could match their interests or hobbies.

When the Programme was first introduced, the only way a person could get a position on Tús was when the DEASP would select an individual who would then be interviewed by a Team Leader on the Programme. In the relatively recent past, the DEASP has introduced an option whereby an individual, who was fully unemployed and who had been in receipt of a jobseekers payment (JA) for 12 months, could now apply to go on the Tús Programme by filling in a 'Self-referral' form. These forms are available from either a local social welfare office or from a Tús Team Leader in their area.

Once a person is placed on Tús with a community and voluntary sector organisation, the type of roles available would/could be as Tidy Towns operatives; there are retail opportunities with Charity shops; General community services helping with things like newsletters or admin with a local group; local heritage projects such as clearing overgrown graveyards or recording headstones; maintenance of sports grounds and facilities or looking after community tracks and walking trails. There are great choices on the Tús Programme for an individual who wants to contribute something to themselves and to their local area. A discussion with a Tús Team Leader from their area would be a great place to start.

Once a community group has an participant placed with them, then the group is in a position to be further supported by way of a small project fund that can help a group with some painting, or help with materials that the Tús participant can use to make flower planters or benches, or trees and flowers could be purchased and the Tús participant could plant these and further enhance their local area. The best way to see what might be available would be for the group to have a chat with the local area Tús Team Leader. Some examples of the types of local projects that have been supported are shown below.




















KNOCKMEALDOWN ACTIVE

Knockmealdown Active is a voluntary group that was initially set up to promote trade and tourism in the communities at the foothills of the Knockmealdown Mountains, Co. Tipperary. While this multi community-based initiative had been predominantly active in the communities of Ardfinnan, Newcastle, Goatenbridge, Clogheen and Ballyporeen, in the past two years, the group has also attracted members from south of the Knockmealdowns and has been involved in many events there, particularly in Mount Melleray, where there is a wonderful, active local community. On April 2nd, 2022, Knockmealdown Active organised a walking event in Mount Melleray that raised almost €20k for Pieta and the Irish Motor Neurone Disease Association via the Climb with Charlie appeal. Further information at www.climbwithcharlie.ie.

It has helped initiate many projects in the region including annually walking the path of St. Declan's Way. The group was to the forefront in the full waymarking, and official opening of, the St. Declan's Way path as a fully recognised national trail in 2021. Gráinne Moynihan, a Knockmealdown Active member, is now Chairperson of the St. Declan's Way Steering Committee. You'll find more information on the path, and this year's event, starting on March 18th, at www.StDeclansWay.ie. There is a limit of 250 walkers for each stage of the event, so book early to avoid missing out on this wonderful 'Irish Camino'.

It also runs the nationally acclaimed, annual, Knock ME Down Adventure Race. This is a multi-disciplinary challenge event that takes place from Newcastle to Bay Lough, outside Clogheen and on to Melleray in Co. Waterford. It facilitates athletes of all ages and fitness levels and showcases all that this beautiful area has to offer to a national and international audience. Full information at www.KnockMeDown.ie.

Knockmealdown Active also regularly partners in various initiatives around the region. In 2022, along with South Tipperary Development Company, it raised and invested €20k into upgrading the access route to Bay Lough lake, close to the Vee. Another €20k is earmarked for works on the Knockmealdown Trail, a popular 32 Kilometre hiking and cycling mountain trail running along the foothills of the Knockmealdown Mountains, from Ballyporeen to Newcastle. The group also maintain another 8 looped walks in the area.

In the course of the year, Knockmealdown Active also undertakes events for its own members. The group have been on several walks and hikes during 2022 (and one in 2023). It has also undertaken a number of outings during the past year on 15 Kayaks which belong to the group. These are used to explore stretches of local rivers such as the Tar and Suir.

We're a pro-active group who are all oriented toward finding new activity ideas and putting them into practice. We are particularly interested in bringing people into this beautiful region to show what it is all about. Economic and environmental sustainability are key factors in the activities we pursue. We are always open to new ways of promoting the area, new activities that can help sustain the region and we love to speak with the people who have these ideas. What are the new cost of living supports announced recently?

The government announced new cost of living supports on 21 February 2023.

People getting social welfare payments

In April 2023, if you are getting the <u>Working Family Payment</u> or any weekly long-term social welfare payment that qualifies for the <u>Christmas Bonus</u>, you will get a once-off payment of €200.

You will only get one €200 payment even if you get more than one qualifying social welfare payment.

In June 2023, you will get an extra €100 for each child with your monthly Child Benefit payment.

<u>Child Benefit</u> is paid to parents or guardians of children under 16 years. You may also get it, if your child is aged 16 or 17 years in full-time education or full-time training or has a disability and cannot support themselves

State exam fees

If you have a child taking the <u>Leaving Certificate</u> or <u>Junior Cycle</u> examination, there will be no exam fees in 2023.

School transport

If your child uses the School Transport Scheme, the fee for the school year 2023-2024 will be reduced to €50 for a <u>primary school child</u> and €75 for a <u>secondary school child</u>. The maximum fee for a family will be €125.

The scheme provides transport for children who live over a certain distance from the appropriate school. Even if your child meets the criteria for school transport, a place is not guaranteed. You can <u>apply from 1 March 2023</u>.

Help for business owners

If you are a business owner, you will have easier access to the <u>Temporary Business Energy Support Scheme (TBESS)</u> to help with businesses energy costs.

- Your business will qualify if it has had a 50% increase in electricity or gas costs (up from 30% increase). This can apply from 1 September 2022.
- The amount you get back will increase to 50% of the cost of eligible electricity and gas bills (up from 40%).

The Scheme is extended to 31 May 2023.

VAT will remain at the 9% reduced rate until 31 August 2023 for hospitality services, and until 31 October 2023 for gas and electricity.
