Bruce Highway bridge repairs - Mackenzie Creek, Cromarty

Lane closures and minor travel delays expected

The Department of Transport and Main Roads (TMR) would like to advise that works are required to repair damage to the Mackenzie Creek bridge, sustained during a truck strike in December 2022.

As a result, northbound lane closures and other traffic impacts are expected on the Bruce Highway at Mackenzie Creek (around 3.12km south of Cape Cleveland Road) from:

Wednesday 4 to Sunday 15 January 2022 Each day between 7.00am and 5.00pm

Works include:

- installation of scaffolding, to ensure a safe work area
- · replacement of bridge barriers
- installation of guardrail to replace damaged guardrails.

What to expect:

- noise from machinery
- lane closures, speed restrictions and other traffic control devices
- · delays of up to five minutes
- traffic controllers and/or temporary signals to assist road users through the works
- · vehicle width restrictions (refer below).

Access to private properties will be unaffected by the works.

All work is subject to construction progress and weather conditions. In the event of wet weather or unforeseen circumstances, these

works will be rescheduled for the next available day shift.
