### **The twelfth *Accounting History* Symposium 2019:**

The 2019 Symposium of SIG2 was successfully held preceding the 2019 AFAANZ Conference in Brisbane on Saturday July 6. The Symposium hosted a keynote speech by Emeritus Prof. Garry Carnegie from RMIT University. On the day, nine accounting history research papers and proposals were presented covering a range of different topics.

### **The tenth *Accounting History* International Conference (10AHIC):**

The 10AHIC on the theme “Accounting and Work in Historical Perspective” was held in Paris, France, during 3-5 September 2019, and was jointly hosted by Conservatoire National des Arts et Métiers (CNAM), University Paris-Dauphine and Skema Business School.

A special issue of the journal on the conference theme is scheduled to be published in 2021.

The conference’s plenary speakers were:

- Professor Alain Supiot (Collège de France, France): “From subordination to programming: the deadlocks of labour governance by numbers”
- Permanent Fellow Samuel Jubé (Institute of Advanced Studies in Nantes, France): “Work and the ‘substance over form’ principle”
