In our first months of being open, being HERE has looked like:

*Monthly events with our District Police.* So far we have gone bowling, made gingerbread houses, played basketball and more. This is an important relationship for our community to foster.

*After-school programming.* It is important for us to be a place where kids know they are expected, welcomed, and supported. Whether it's homework, a snack, a fun activity, or someone to talk to - after school programming has been a consistent space for our community to gather.

**Created to Create.** A time set aside for arts and crafts. We have enjoyed watching our community try new things, hone in on skill sets, and show off their work. You don't have to be an expert to enjoy this creative space.

*New partnerships.* This space has empowered us to work alongside other great organizations. We have been able to provide hip hop class from Above the Clouds, exercise classes from Milwaukee Rec, community resources through DWD, and a place for basketball practice for Howard Fuller Collegiate Academy. These are just a few of the ways we have been able to better support our community.

One of our kiddos recently said it best, "I came to play basketball, but I have found a group of people that truly cares about how I am doing. I have made new friends here, but more than that I know I can always come here to escape the drama that is too easy to become a part of."

Shechem is more than a building, but because of that building, men, women, and children have a safe environment to begin to explore how life can look different. Not just for themselves, but for the greater community as a whole.
