	<p>Many disabled people do not get to make their own decisions about starting a family.</p>
	<p>We will hear disabled people's stories about making their own decisions.</p>



We want to know if people with disabilities can get contraception and family planning.



We want to know if disabled people can get an abortion if they want one.



We want to know how people with disabilities experience maternity services.



We want to know about disabled people who are parents.



We will look at the laws about people with disabilities making these kinds of decisions.



We will make a toolkit for health care and service staff showing them how to support disabled people.

Who are disabled people?



We want to hear the experiences of people with all types of disabilities.



We include people who have used mental health services



We want to hear from people in all types of relationships, including gay and straight people



We want to hear from people who are living in Ireland from different backgrounds.



We include people who come from other countries like refugees.



We include Irish Travellers and Roma.

How the project works



The project has a research team



The research team are supported by a Stakeholders Group.



They will help the researchers with questions about the project.

The Stakeholder Group will have 3 private meetings.



The project will have Discussion Groups.

20 people will be invited to take part in each Discussion Group.



This will include people with disabilities, lawyers, health and social care workers.



The Discussion Group will talk about one topic at each meeting.



The Discussion Group will have 4 private meetings.



The project will have 6 Regional Ambassadors.



They will tell people in their region about the project.
