The Museum is dedicated to the preservation, advancement and presentation of the maritime history and shipwrecks of the North Carolina Outer Banks from the earliest periods of exploration and/or colonization to the present day, with particular emphasis on the period from 1524 to 1945. The Museum preserves, researches, exhibits and interprets its collections for the benefit of the public and specialized audiences. The Museum serves its diverse audiences to inspire appreciation, encourage discovery, and promote an active, responsible understanding of the maritime heritage of the Outer Banks and in relation to that of the United States and the broader history of seafaring.

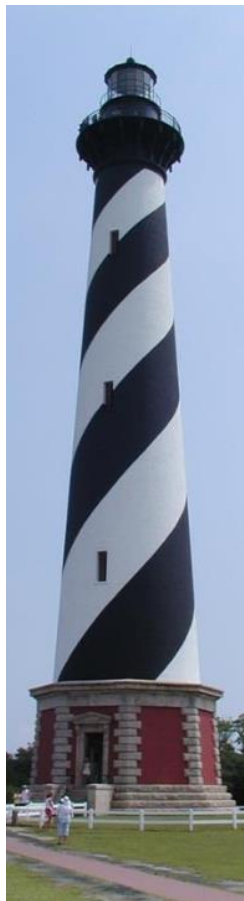
Cape Hatteras Lighthouse - 46379 Lighthouse Rd, Buxton, NC 27920

The Cape Hatteras Lighthouse, also known as America's Lighthouse, is the tallest brick beacon in the country, standing 208 feet. The familiar black and white spiral-striped landmark serves as a warning to mariners of submerged and shifting sandbars which extend almost twenty miles off Cape Hatteras into the Atlantic Ocean. They are known as the Diamond Shoals.

WALK / DRIVE TO HATTERAS LANDING FOR SHOPPING

Once you reach the point where there are about five houses remaining, start looking for the traveled footbaths between the dunes, which will lead you to one of the public board walks and over to the shops at Hatteras Landing.

TAKE A BEACH WALK TO FLAMBEAU STREET SHIP

The shipwreck can usually be found walking down the Beach Babies boardwalk to the beach. Once on the beach, turn left walking up the beach about a ½ mile. The wreck can usually be seen protruding from the sand at the water's edge. However, the storms and waves can shift the sand in the area often, sometimes leaving more of the wreck exposed, and other times completely covering the shipwreck.

GHOST CRAB HUNTS

Bring your flashlights and batteries for a favorite evening activity. Kids of all ages love looking for ghost crabs on the beach after dark.

Ghost crab hunting has become a very popular pastime in recent years, as it allows the entire family to have an excuse to stay out a little late and enjoy a little more beach time outside of the daylight hours. In addition, it's a completely free activity that everyone in the family can get on board with, especially the youngest members of the group, as the excitement of spotting a crab generally elicits a lot of squeals and shrieks along the way. Ghost crabs are essentially harmless and will very quickly shy away from humans. At the very worst, a ghost crab hunter may suffer a toe or hand nibble if they get too close, (a pinch that will barely break the skin), and at best, a family of ghost crab hunters will get some incredible pictures and some equally incredible vacation memories along the way.

Ghost crab hunters essentially only need two things: a quiet Hatteras night, and a flashlight, to ensure a successful "hunt". However, there are a few other tips and tricks to keep in mind to ensure not only a successful ghost crab hunt, but ones that's filled with endless "catches".

- **First and foremost, "hunters" are reminded to not hurt the crabs. This is strictly a chasing activity.**
- If possible, wear darker clothing and tread as quietly as possible, Ghost crabs are very observant and rely on their sense of something being out of place to protect them from any possible predators. Keep your flashlight light well out in front of you to find ghost crabs before you've even remotely intruded on their area.
- Once a ghost crab is captured in a flashlight beam, it will stand motionless for a moment while it collects its bearings. This is an ideal time to take a few photos and / or get an up-close look at the critter before it scurries away.
- **Whatever you do, don't attempt to poke, prod, or pick up a ghost crab.** Although clearly not fatal, a ghost crab pinch can still be a little painful, and it's best to take a picture, either on camera or via a mental recollection, and allow the ghost crab to be on its way.

- The best time to find ghost crabs is during the prime summer months, from late May until early September, when they are out on patrol in full force. Stick close to the shoreline, in between the low tide and high tide lines for the best hunting grounds and keep an eye out for small holes that range from the circumference of a nickel to the circumference of half dollar. Chances are if you spot these little holes, there's a ghost crab or two nearby.
- When it comes to the best beaches to find ghost crabs, the quieter and more secluded the better. Beaches with little night traffic, including pedestrians, beach bonfires, or vehicular traffic, are the best ghost crab hunting grounds. Luckily, Hatteras has these beaches in abundance, and generally all a guest must do is head to the nearest beach pathway to start their hunting expedition.

Hunting for ghost crabs is arguably one of the most popular Hatteras local pastimes. Easy to do, completely free of charge, and enjoyable for family members of all ages, a ghost crab hunt can turn into some incredible wildlife spotting and photos in the best of circumstances, and a quietly pleasant wander down the beach under the stars during the worst circumstances.

Simply grab a flashlight, throw on the flip-flops and head to the beach. Regardless of whether you spot a crab skittering by or not, you're sure to find that the cool ocean breezes and the vast canopy of stars is a treasure worth discovering all its own.

FIREWORKS ARE ILLEGAL ON HATTERAS ISLAND

The National Park Service would like to remind all park visitors that federal regulations prohibit the use and possession of fireworks anywhere within the boundaries of Cape Hatteras National Seashore, Fort Raleigh National Historic Site and Wright Brothers National Memorial. This includes all Seashore beaches and the beaches in front of all Hatteras Island Villages.

Dare County Board of Commissioners passed an ordinance that took effect on June 1, 2007 which prohibits all fireworks on Hatteras Island. The Town of Nags Head, Town of Kill Devil Hills, and Town of Manteo issue permits for professionally performs and scheduled firework displays within their junctions.

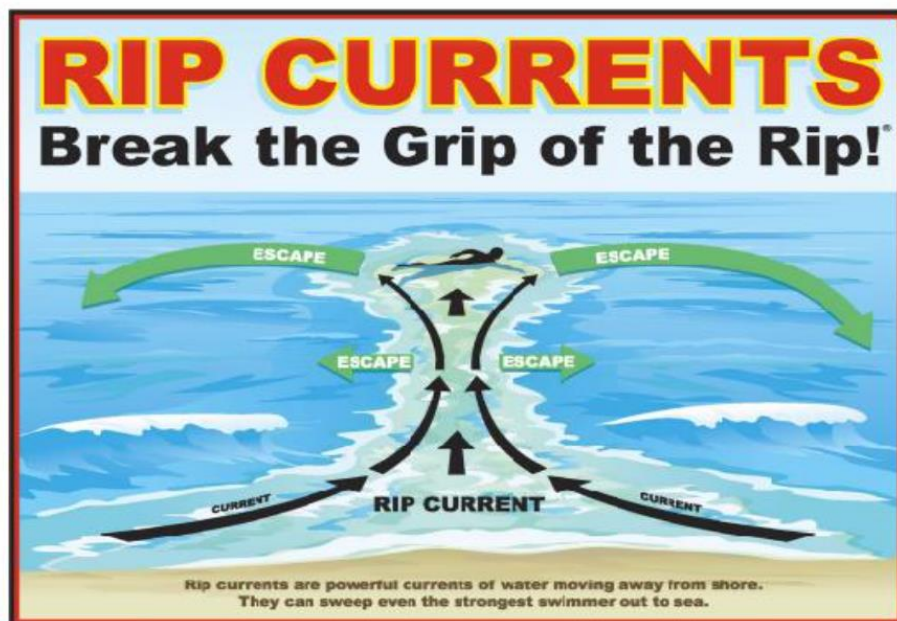

RIP CURRENTS – EDUCATE YOUR FAMILY AND GUESTS

Rip Currents are a very real danger on the beaches of Cape Hatteras. Be aware of what to look for to identify a rip current and talk to your family and guests about how to escape a rip tide by swimming parallel to the beach until you are out of the current. Once you are out of the current, you can then swim towards the beach. Rip Currents can occur in both good and bad weather days with both calm and rough ocean.

IF CAUGHT IN A RIP CURRENT

- ◆ **Don't fight the current**
- ◆ **Swim out of the current, then to shore**
- ◆ **If you can't escape, float or tread water**
- ◆ **If you need help, call or wave for assistance**

- ◆ **Know how to swim**
- ◆ **Never swim alone**
- ◆ **If in doubt, don't go out**

BEACH FIRES AND PERMITS

A family favorite activity is bon fires on the beach in the evening. Small bundles of wood can be purchased at several locations in the village like Red & White and Nedo 's Hardware. Pick up some long wood stick matches and fire starters to get your fire started easily. Beach Babies usually has skewers at the house for your convenience but they are often used so it wouldn't hurt to pick up a pack along with your marshmallows and Hershey chocolate bars for smores.

Having a fire on the Cape Hatteras National Seashore requires a beach fire permit. I've included a copy of our permit at the end of this document for your convenience. The permits are free and available at the Ranger Station at the Cape Hatteras Lighthouse in Buxton, NC. Make a stop on your way into Beach Babies.

OFF-ROAD VEHICLE USE PERMITS

Obtaining an ORV permit is an easy process that takes only minutes from start to finish. You can choose to visit a visitor center at Cape Hatteras National Seashore in person or you can visit the Cape Hatteras ORV Permit page at [Recreation.gov](https://www.recreation.gov).

The **online permit process** is as simple as:

1. Going to the [Cape Hatteras ORV Permit page on Recreation.gov](https://www.recreation.gov)
2. Filling out the online application, and
3. Print the permit and proof-of-permit and place them in your vehicle (Annual proof-of-permit stickers will be mailed, but the printed proof-of-permit is good for 30 days).

The **in-person permit process** has six easy steps:

1. Go to one of the [three visitor centers](#).
2. Show the required documentation to the National Park Service staff members selling permits.
3. Fill out the ORV permit.
4. Watch the 7-minute video (you can skip this step if you bring last year's permit).
5. Pay for your permit.
6. Place the permit in your vehicle's glove box and affix the proof-of-permit to your vehicle's windshield.

That's all there is to it. You'll be off enjoying the beaches of Cape Hatteras National Seashore before you know it. In preparation for getting your permit, be sure you have:

- your driver's license
- your vehicle registration
- form of payment (charge card or cash)
- and last year's permit (if available, for the in-person process)

Two types of permits are available for purchase. They are:

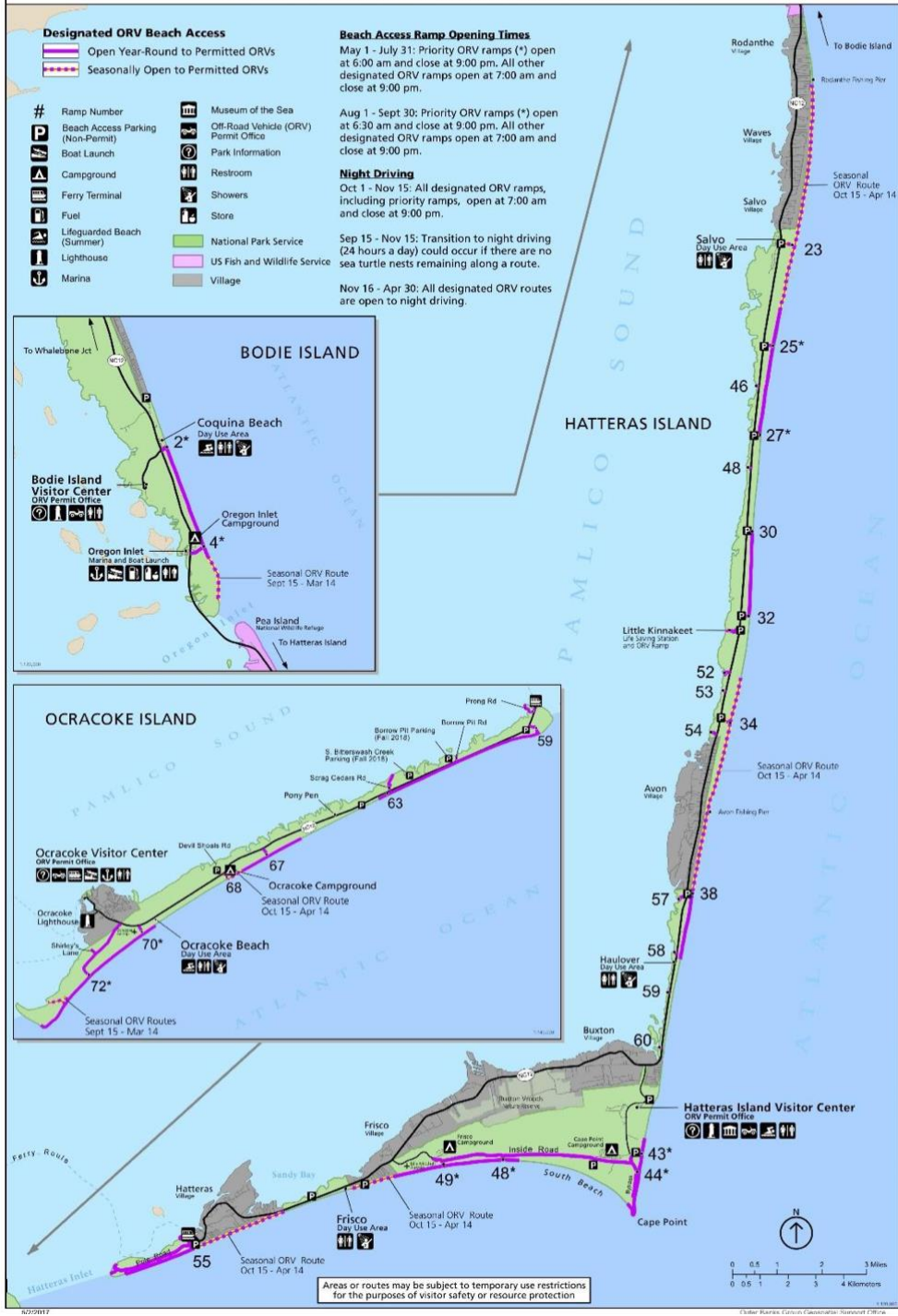
- a 10-day Permit (\$50, valid for 10 consecutive days)
- or an Annual Permit (\$120, valid for one year from date of purchase).



Remember to keep the permit in the glove box of your permitted vehicle and the proof-of-permit sticker clearly visible on your windshield.
